Dear Senator:

The revision of Chapter 28 [Adjudicative Proceedings for the Resolution of Differences] that you amended and approved on May 12 was considered by the Senate Executive Committee at a special meeting on May 16. In his response to the Senate action, President Gerberding wrote that he did not like two of the amendments made by the Senate on May 12, but decided not to oppose them. He indicated that he will sign the legislation if the Senate approves it on May 26 and if passed by the Faculty. (A copy of his thoughtful letter is attached to your agenda as item number 10.)

The Executive Committee unanimously approved Chapter 28 as received from the Senate. No further amendments of any type were made. Thus, on May 26, you will be asked to vote on exactly the same document that received approval on May 12.

Please plan on attending this last regularly scheduled Senate meeting of the academic year,

Thursday, May 26, 2:30 p.m., in Gowen Hall.

Needless to say, it is extremely important to have a quorum at this meeting. May 26 is the Thursday before Memorial Day weekend, and you might have made plans that include Thursday afternoon. We need to hear from you if you cannot attend this meeting in order to establish and maintain a quorum sufficient to complete Senate consideration of this legislation, as well as the other items on the agenda. We will again be calling Senators to ask whether or not you will be able to attend. This is quite a job, however, for our small staff, and it would be very helpful if you would take the initiative to call in first (whether or not you plan to attend) and save our staff as many calls as possible.

Yesterday, we sent a letter to all faculty, letting them know that they may soon have the opportunity to vote on our revision of adjudication procedures. In case you have not yet received yours, it should be arriving shortly. It is likely that some of your constituents may be approaching you with questions regarding this mailing. If you are
